

50 Early American Rococo Gas Lighting fixtures (and catalogs) are now rare. For the period between 1840 and 1870, less than 5 catalogs are known in existence. Starr, Fellows & Co, New York issued one such catalog in March 1857. We have a copy. We also have been fortunate to find no less than 8 original fixtures manufactured by Starr, Fellows of various sizes and configurations with a wealth of matched parts, allowing us to offer proven provenances. As these fixtures are so beautiful, we simply could not put later era 4" fitter Victorian gas

shades on them as so many owners of antique lights have been forced to do. So, we re-created the rare, C.1855, 2 5/8" fitter gas shades of 046G, 061G and 086G which are hand blown; hand cut; and hand trimmed, and hence, a bit more primitive looking than crisp machine made products. But, these shades give the correct ambiance to the reproductions of early gas chandeliers (gasoliers). These are very heavy fixtures compared to later thinner lights. All of our lights are UL approved and made by the re-known maker: **Heritage Lighting.**

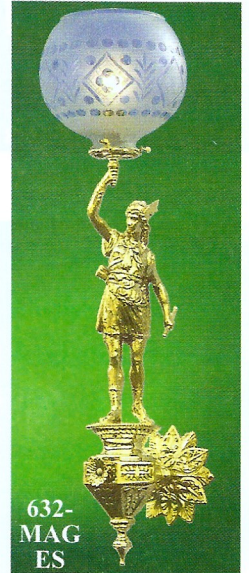

A 3/8" IPS internal all-thread pipe is inside the brass tube for fastening to the fixture. Extension kits can be connected together, in multiples, for very tall ceilings.

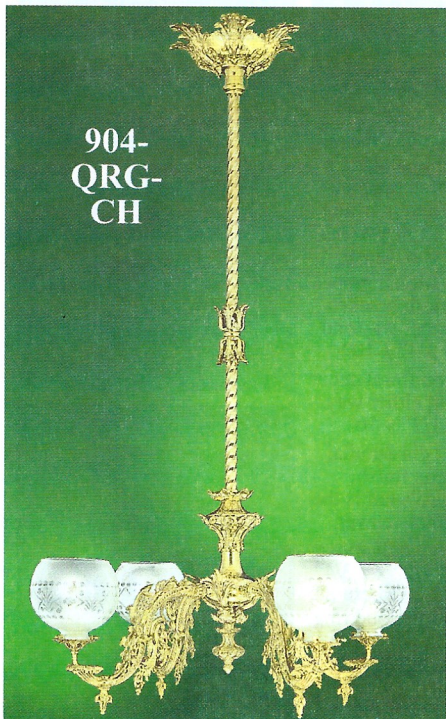
