80-CCL-TL Low ceiling Light

In comparison with 456 and 458 which are very nice fancy low ceiling lights, we illustrate our simple 80-CCL-TL. "Gas Fixture & Brass Co.", of Cleveland, Ohio catalogued

this ceiling light in their catalog of 1910. Measured with shades: Height only 11"; Spread: 26"; Canopy: 5"dia.

This light mounts to the electrical box, in the ceiling, with a piece of all thread which is threaded into the crossbar (supplied) with the decorative finial.

For older homes that do not have wall light switches, cord pull switches can be added to any light we sell

In the early 1900's, when elaborate decoration was giving way to inexpensive lightweight design, a few companies continued to design better quality lighting. They continued to create the high end which, in this case, are cast & pierced bodies w/-elaborate armback decorations. Represented here are what was the "high end" of Late Victorian electric lighting.
